Bio	Carmel Pilcher is a Josephite Sister who has taught liturgy in many dioceses in Australia and beyond. Carmel was Director of Liturgy in the Archdiocese of Sydney for more than 10 years; has a PhD entitled the Prophetic Character of Liturgy from Flinders University of SA; has held offices in national and international liturgical organisations; written and published including 'Vatican II Reforming Liturgy'; ran liturgical workshops in September in Flores Indonesia, and is currently working on a project researching aboriginal ritual and symbol.
