It also articulates the doctrinal principles behind how Mass is celebrated and explains why we do the things we do.</p> <p>It is vital that anyone involved in planning or celebrating liturgy, including presiders, pastoral associates, parish liturgy teams, those who plan school Masses and liturgical ministers, have a good understanding of this key liturgy document.</p> <p>This session outlines the broad content and key features of the General Instruction, highlights recent changes and explores the practical implementation of the principles and practices it espouses.</p>
